

### PRESENTATIONS

- Northumbria Police (George and Ryan from Neighbourhood Policing Team) presented stats from their team, highlighting that there were 347 crimes in an eight-week period in West Bedlington which is large drop, around 25%, in crime compared to earlier in the year.
- A member of the public asked if there was any way to get a speed camera near Wetherspoons/West Moorland Avenue and the Neighbourhood Policing Team said they would action this – possibly getting an unmarked vehicle to monitor the area.
- Councillor Thompson mentioned speeding on Church Lane and it was noted by the Neighbourhood Policing Team.
- Member of the public mentioned that speeding was a concern to lots of people who had attended the cycle path meeting, so it was suggested by the Neighbourhood Policing Team that a letter drop could be looked at for certain affected estates to gather local opinions.
- A member of the public was concerned about e-bike speeding and it was agreed it was an issue for further discussion/consideration.
- Member of the public mentioned issue on B331 regarding speeding and it was noted.
- Contact details left if anyone needed to get in touch with the Neighbourhood Policing Team after the meeting.

#### QUESTIONS TO THE COUNCIL

- A member of the public was concerned about the cycle path and wanted to know how Northumberland County Council can start work without any plans or local people knowing what is happening. Councillor Taylor (Chair) said there is a set of plans coming soon, but this does not include path widths, so West Bedlington Town Council are going to ask Northumberland County Council to provide specific details.
- A member of the public thanked West Bedlington Town Council for the Christmas events provided, in particular the Magic of Christmas event which they had enjoyed and attended.
- A member of the public asked about bus shelters on the new cycle path it was noted that West Bedlington Town Council have had no requests from Northumberland County Council about providing bus shelters along the cycleway.
- Another member of the public thanked West Bedlington Town Council for the Magic of Christmas event and also asked for an update on the Neighbourhood Plan. Councillor Taylor said more details will be provided in January 2025.
